Door to Door for Life

Update on Abby Johnson, Unplanned, and the Pill

In our review of former Planned Parenthood director Abby Johnson's book, Unplanned (February RTL newsletter), we noted that, although the book is extremely valuable in many ways, Johnson evidently had yet to understand the full implications of promotion of contraception (the birth control pill, in particular). It appears that she now appreciates this connection. Below are excerpts from Abby's blog post (1/10/2011) at www.abbyjohnson.org:

When I worked for Planned Parenthood, I said this ALL of the time. "The only way to reduce the number of abortions is to reduce the number of unintended pregnancies. The only way to reduce the number of unintended pregnancies is to increase the supply of contraceptive methods." ... It kind of seems to make sense when you look at it. But, in reality, it makes no sense at all. It was just another justification I told myself over and over again to help me feel better about the abortions I was party to.

Studies show that contraception DOESN'T actually reduce the number of abortions. A recent study actually showed the opposite. The higher the contraception rate, the higher the abortion rate. ... And here's the truth from my experience. I rarely counseled a women who was having an abortion that wasn't using a method when she got pregnant.

My husband and I have chosen to use Natural Family Planning, the Creighton Model. It is a very advanced form of fertility management that allows both partners to be involved...the way it was intended. That model may not be for you. You may choose something else. But, I think if women actually knew the dangers of hormonal birth control, they would not likely take it.

One more thing. When do you think life begins? I believe life begins at conception...when the egg and sperm meet.... If you also believe life begins at conception, then you should have a hard time getting behind hormonal methods. Hormonal methods work three ways. One way is to prevent ovulation. But if that fails and "breakthrough ovulation" occurs, then conception can occur. Another way hormonal methods work is by irritating the uterine lining to the point that a fertilized egg (a human person) would not be able to implant on the uterine wall and begin to grow. So, the woman passes the fertilized egg (human person) with her cycle and miscarries without even knowing it. It is sad, but that happens MANY times while women are on hormonal methods. That is why people will say that hormonal methods have an abortifacient property in them...because they can actually cause an abortion.

There is a really great documentary out called "28 Days on the Pill."... It was actually created by Protestant ministers. We need churches to get on board with this and stop pushing the pill and other methods within their congregation. The pill is not healthy for women and for marriages. There are other ways that are better and don't take the lives of children. People need to know the truth.

In Memoriam: Abortionist-Turned-Pro-Lifer, Dr. Bernard Nathanson

Dr. Bernard Nathanson died February 21 after a long battle with cancer. Nathanson wasn't always pro-life and he started out as an abortion practitioner based in New York City who presided over more than 75,000 abortions. But the doctor hoped he saved many more lives than that after witnessing an ultrasound and becoming pro-life. He then dedicated his life to ending abortions and his video, the Silent Scream, is considered a classic because it was the first to use the technology of ultrasound to make the unambiguous case that unborn children are human beings who deserve legal protection starting at their earliest days.

The video, showing an unborn baby recoiling from an abortion, and a follow-up titled Eclipse of Reason that explained in great medical detail the different kinds of abortion procedures, solidified Nathanson's standing as a pro-life hero and an authentic convert who would lead the way for others, like Norma McCorvey and Abby Johnson, to follow his footsteps.

"Today our movement mourns the passing of one of its greatest voices for life," pro-life activist Lila Rose told LifeNews.com. "Dr. Nathanson is a testament to God's grace; that any heart can be transformed into a beacon of love and truth."

Nathanson also earned praise for his candid admission that the pro-abortion movement — led by him as the head of the pro-abortion group NARAL — made up huge numbers of women killed and injured by illegal abortions in an attempt to legalize abortion. "We spoke of 5,000 – 10,000 deaths a year...I confess that I knew the figures were totally false..it was a useful figure, widely accepted, so why go out of our way to correct it with honest statistics?"

In 1996, Nathanson wrote his autobiography, The Hand of God, in which he shared his journey from abortion practitioner and abortion advocate to becoming pro-life. He noted, regretfully, "I am one of those who helped usher in this barbaric age."

"Once we had ultrasound in place, we could study the fetus and see it was a member of our community. If you don't do that, you're just a creature of political ideology. In 1970, there were approximately 1,100 articles on the functioning of the fetus. By 1990, there were 22,000. The data piled up swiftly and opened a window into the womb," Nathanson continued.

Stephen Vincent of the National Catholic Register, wrote, "His pro-life witness could not easily be dismissed as one-sided propaganda since Nathanson had enjoyed such a high standing among abortion supporters as a co-founder of the National Association for the Repeal of Abortion Laws (now called NARAL ProChoice America), and as operator of what he called the nation's busiest abortion business."
